With the impact of the corona virus continuing, the HCP has established rules and regulations for clubs using the HCP indoor Couvelier Center for their meetings.

- Social distancing is a must. 6' or 2 meters distance between members is mandated.
- Masks are mandatory.

- Couples from the same household must sit together.
- This means that if only single folks attend, the number of seats is limited to 22.
- If couples come, and they are coupled, then 40 is the maximum number that can attend a meeting.
- If the board decides to continue with the set agenda of meetings for the 20-21 year, it will be on a first come first served basis. This means that when the newsletter is sent out, members will be required to send the number from their family who will be attending. How to **ZOOM**

A brief guide to help you get started.

To join a meeting, click on the link you'll receive from the Chapter.

Select open, when prompted, to join the meeting. If you have not already downloaded the software, click on "download and run Zoom"


If nothing prompts from browser, download & run Zoom.

You'll be prompted to input your name, which is what will appear on screen:

Then click "Join Meeting" and turn your volume up to listen and watch. If prompted, select "Join with Video" You'll see all other participants who are attending the meeting. If your device doesn't have a camera, only your name will be displayed.



The layout of the meeting on your screen will vary depending on your device. It will look slightly different on an iPad vs. a PC or Smart Phone. The control options (icons), however, are the same.



The Chat option allows you to write a note to the Host or to everyone. It will likely be disabled during the meeting.

The Share Screen icon will be limited to the Speaker whose presentation will be displayed full-screen.

Couvelier Pavilion Rental Rate Changes

Since October 2013, when the HCP opened the Couvelier Pavilion, the rental rate for garden clubs has not changed. It is \$150.00 per event, with no time limit. A one-hour meeting costs the same as an all-evening event of 6 hours or more.



At our meetings, the doors are open to members at 7 pm and we are usually done by 9 pm. However, the setup crew of 4 to 6 board members arrive at 6:30 and leave at 9:30, most nights. Our time is usually about 3 hours.

Starting in January, all rentals are now by the hour. General rental is \$100.00 per hour, with garden clubs receiving a 25% discount to \$75.00.

For the duration of COVID-19 restrictions, the pavilion is set up for the college classroom with twenty 4-foot tables with chairs, set 6 feet apart. This will reduce the advance time the setup crew needs to arrive at, as we only need to have additional chairs for couples.

There are also <u>no</u> tea/coffee/goodies or raffle to prepare or clean up after.

So our hope is, starting in January, to maintain about a 2-hour time frame for as long as COVID-19 lasts. This will keep our rental to the same \$150.00

Bear in mind that when we were at Garth Homer, we paid \$300.00 per night. HCP has been 50% less, so if we need to be over 2 hours and pay for 3 hours, the extra \$75.00 is still a savings over the Garth Homer rate.
